Decorate an item to look like your favourite book character. You could choose a stone, a wooden spoon or something else!


8 Turn the story of your favourite book into a play script. Can you act it out?




10 Make a puppet of a famous book character.

If you could write a non-fiction book, what would you write about? Write down five facts about your chosen








15 Story hunt.

19 What would happen to your favourite character in a different story? Can you write a new tale?




20 Design a new book cover for your favourite book. What will you change?
