Year 6 - Dan & Vivienne

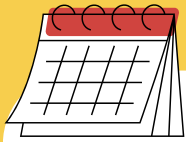
Library Monitors

This week, Liz from Usborne books brought in over 350 books to add to our library, which the children are so excited to read.

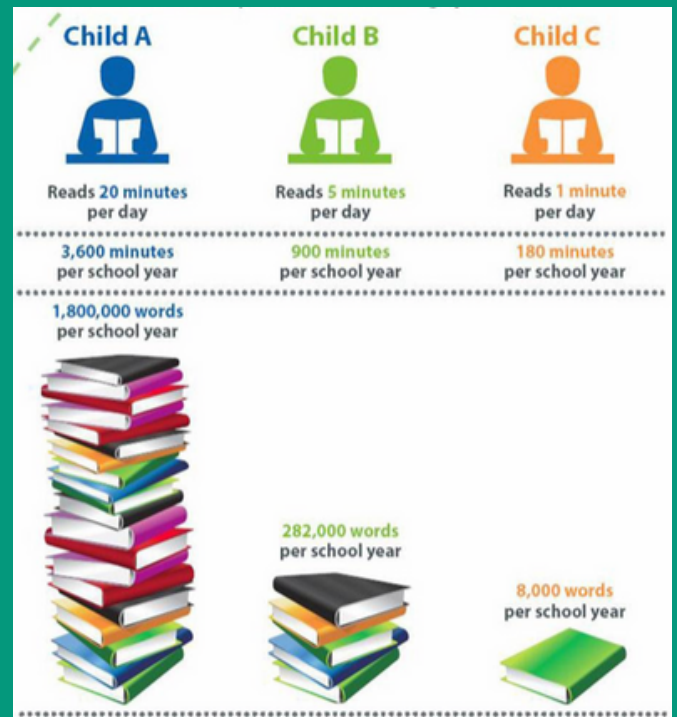

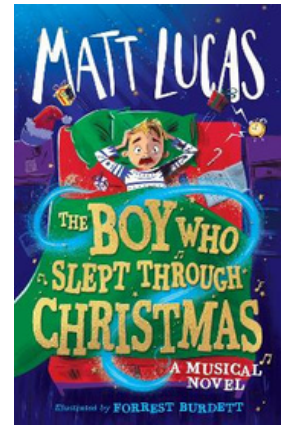
