












Children must wear Yellow PE top, Plain bottle green or black top, or our new green PE top with the school Logo on

<u>Jewellery</u>

On health and safety grounds the only jewellery permitted is a wrist watch (digital/analogue) and ear rings. Children must not wear Smart Watches or devices that can connect to internet, phone or have games on. Children may wear a simple/basic 'Fitbit' or pedometer. Ear rings must be plain silver or gold stud ear rings only - children will be required to remove any all other jewellery. Long hair must be tied up for PE and nail varnish must not be worn. We have bobbles in school if children forget or if their bobbles break.

Bags

The school does not have the room to accommodate backpacks/rucksacks. Only school bags are allowed.

Children must not wear Smart Watches. They will be taken off them and stored away in a lock cupboard.

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis





Build

Predict

Ask your child to predict what they think is going to happen next. Build reading together into your daily routine.

Find a quiet, comfortable place to read together away from any distractions.



Ask about their opinion of the book. Discuss story, style likes and dislikes.

Try to connect the story to your child's own world. Reading at Home With Your

With Your Start to cover Child

If your child mispronounces a word, do not interrupt. Allow them time to selfcorrect.

If it is the same book, ask your child to recap what has happaned so far.

If it is a new book, start by looking at the cover, title, pictures and blurb.

Discuss and research the meaning of any unfamiliar words or phrases.

Parking Reminders

TACKLING

Parking illegally or inconsiderately can create significant problems for other road users and pedestrians, particularly those with push chairs or using mobility scooters.

Parking enforcement In Cheshire East, Cheshire West and Chester, and Warrington

The enforcement of yellow lines, time-limited parking and other parking restrictions in Cheshire is entirely the responsibility of the local authorities and their parking enforcement teams.

In Halton

Obstruction

A vehicle causing an obstruction is one which has been parked and left unattended in such a way that it is considered to be a hazard to pedestrians or other road users. For example, a car parked on a bend in the road. This also includes blocking free passage to pedestrians and blocking access to private or public

If you need to contact the police because a vehicle is causing a safety hazard or an obstruction on a public road, please contact Cheshire Police on the non-emergency number, 101.

Do not report illegal parking via social media.

All road users need to be aware of and adhere to parking restrictions:

- · No parking on bends
- · No parking on zigzag lines
- Do not obstruct a resident's driveway
- · Do not park on double lines
- · Do not park on 'time-limited' single lines
- · Do not cause an obstruction
